

Know the FACTS about PROP 1



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“Every person has the right to reproductive freedom and privacy.” (2a) *It does not distinguish age or ensure parents are involved when minors seek abortion services.*



“A health care provider” is defined as “a licensed person or an entity that provides health care or medical treatment.” (5f) *This could be broadly expanded to apply, for example, to any staff working in an abortion facility.*

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Doctors may use their medical judgment to treat miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies.



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
